

## SENATE BILLS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

**S. 1778**

**Sept. 27, 2005**

**MR. GRASSLEY AND MR. BAUCUS**

To extend medicare cost-sharing for qualifying individuals through September 2006, to extend the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program, transitional medical assistance under the Medicaid Program, and related programs through March 31, 2006, and for other purposes.

Sept. 27, 2005. Referred to the Senate Committee on Finance.

Sept. 29, 2005. Senate Committee on Finance discharged by unanimous consent.

Sept. 29, 2005. Passed the Senate, amended, by unanimous consent.

Sept. 29, 2005. Received in the House and referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker.

Oct. 12, 2005. Referred to the Subcommittees on Health and Human Resources with respect to those provisions with respect to those provisions under their jurisdiction.

**MR. INHOFE, MR. ROCKEFELLER, MS. LANDRIEU, AND MR. CRAIG**

To amend part E of title IV of the Social Security Act to provide for the making of foster care maintenance payments to private for-profit agencies.

Oct. 19, 2005. Passed the Senate by unanimous consent.

Oct. 20, 2005. Received in the House and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Nov. 9, 2005. Passed the House, under suspension of the rules, by a vote of 408 yeas, 1 nay.

Nov. 22, 2005. Approved. Public Law 109-113.

**MRS. FEINSTEIN, MR. KYL, MR. BINGAMAN, MS. SNOWE, AND MR. CORNYN**

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide that the Tax Court may review claims for equitable innocent spouse relief and to suspend the running on the period of limitations while such claims are pending.

June 15, 2006. Referred to the Senate Committee on Finance.

Sept. 30, 2006. Senate Committee on Finance discharged by unanimous consent and passed the Senate by unanimous consent.

Nov. 9, 2006. Received in the House and held at the desk.

Nov. 13, 2006. Referred to the House Committee on Ways and Means.

**June 15, 2006**

**MR. GRASSLEY AND MR. BURNS**

To amend subpart 2 of part B of title IV of the Social Security Act to improve outcomes for children in families affected by methamphetamine abuse and addiction, to reauthorize the promoting safe and stable families program, and for other purposes.

June 15, 2006. Senate Committee on Finance reported an original measure, no written report filed.

June 23, 2006. Written report S.Rept. 109-269 filed by the Senate Committee on Finance.

July 13, 2006. Passed the Senate, amended, by unanimous consent.

July 17, 2006. Received in the House, and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

July 25, 2006. Passed, under suspension of the rules, with an amendment

(text of H.R. 5640), by voice vote.

July 25, 2006. The title of the measure was amended and agreed to without objection.

Sept. 20, 2006. The Senate concurred with amendments in the House amendments.

Sept. 26, 2006. The House, under suspension of the rules, agreed to the Senate amendments to the House amendments by voice vote.

Dec. 7, 2006. Passed the Senate by unanimous consent.

Dec. 7, 2006. Received in the House.

Dec. 9, 2006. Considered by unanimous consent and passed without objection.

Dec. 9, 2006. Cleared for White House.

Dec. 20, 2006. Presented to the President.

Dec. 22, 2006. Approved. P.L. 109-465.
