## **GPO SEES BRISK SALES OF SENATE YEAR 2000 REPORT**

The Government Printing Office (GPO) is experiencing brisk sales of the recently released report *Investigating the Impact of the Year 2000 Problem* (S. Rpt. 106-10). In the first 3 days of sales through GPO (March 3-5), nearly 700 copies were sold to or ordered by the public. GPO is also making the report available online free of charge via its award-winning GPO Access service.

Produced by the U.S. Senate Special Committee on the Year 2000 Technology Problem (Senator Robert F. Bennett, Chairman, and Senator Christopher J. Dodd, Vice Chairman), *Investigating the Impact of the Year 2000 Problem* details the scope of the Year 2000 problem and assesses its impact on critical economic sectors: utilities, health care, telecommunications, transportation, financial services, general government, and general business. The report also discusses the prospect of litigation and international preparedness.

Following the initial print run of the 163-page report by GPO, copies were distributed to the Special Committee and other congressional offices, to Federal depository libraries nationwide (where they are available for the free use of the public), and for sale to the public.

GPO Public Printer Michael F. DiMario said, "Supporting the Senate Special Committee on the Year 2000 Technology Problem by providing widespread public access to the Committee's report is a key mission of the GPO. We are pleased to see the public's response to *Investigating the Impact of the Year 2000 Problem* through our sales, depository library, and online programs."

GPO has also made *Investigating the Impact of the Year 2000 Problem* available to the public online free of charge. The report can be accessed on the GPO Access website, at [www.access.gpo.gov/congress/senate/sp106-10.html](http://www.access.gpo.gov/congress/senate/sp106-10.html). The report is in Portable Document Format (PDF) and requires Adobe Acrobat software to access it.
